His son, Henry VIII becomes King.  Henry VIII forms the Church of England, separating it from the Roman Catholic Church.  Henry VIII dies. His son, Edward VI becomes King aged 9 years old.  Edward VI dies and the throne is given to Lady Jane Grey (Edward's cousin once removed) for just 9 days before Mary I takes the throne.  Mary I dies. Her half-sister Elizabeth I is Queen of England.  The Spanish Armada is defeated by the English.  Queen Elizabeth I dies ending the Tudor reign.
